

23 Worship Ideas for Cell Groups

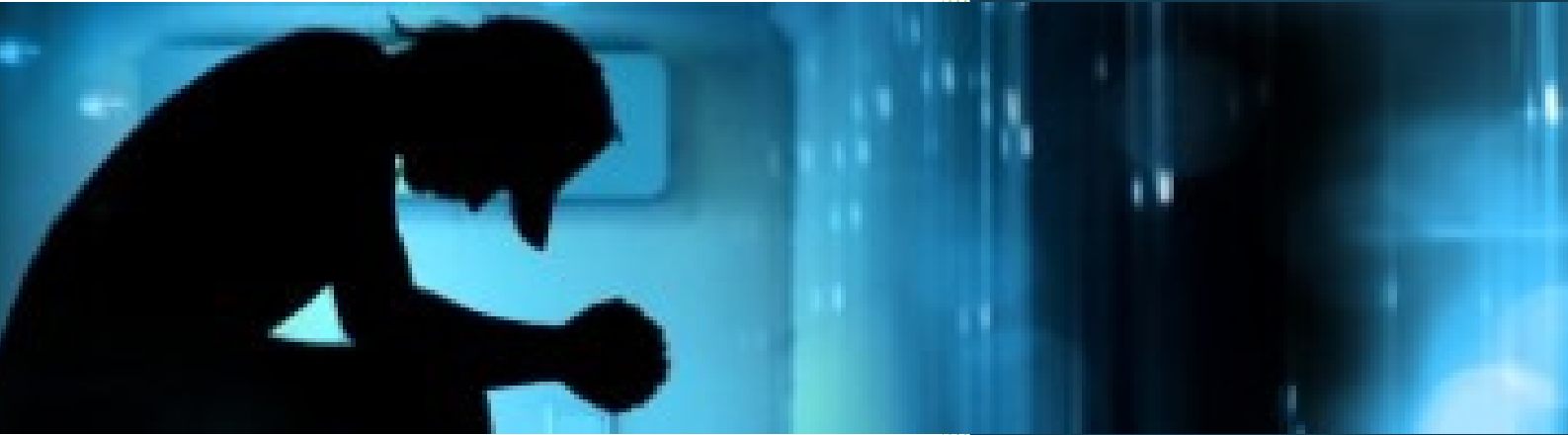


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Worship Idea 1: No one but our God

This worship idea is based on Psalm 113 – copy 4 times – 3 readers and whole group together

After the Reading of Psalm 113.

1 Leader: There is no god like our God. There is no other god who fights for us or forgives us without punishment first. There is no other god who lavishes gifts and teaches that we do the same. There is no other god who gives himself so fully to those who so often ignore Him.

Group: No one but our God.

2 Leader: Who will go before us and level the obstacles that stand in our way?

Group: No one but our God.

3 Leader: Who will subdue our enemies, those enemies of our minds and our spirits?

Group: No one but our God.

1 Leader: Who can say to the oceans, “Dry up” and they obey?

Group: No one but our God

2 Leader: Who would give unsearchable riches to those He has called?

Group: No one but our God.

3 Leader: Who would take an insignificant person like me and call me, by name, to do great things for Him?

Group: No one but our God..

2 Leader: Who has created the light of day and the darkness of night?

Group: No one but our God.

1 Leader: Who can rain down righteousness and demand that salvation spring up?

Group: No one but our God.

3 Leader: Who is the potter that moulds and makes the perfect object for His use?

Group: No one but our God.

2 Leader: Who can decide who will fall and who will rise; who will live and who will die; who will win and who will lose?

Group: No one but our God.

1 Leader: There is no other God like our God. He is awesome, brilliant and commanding. He is all powerful, all knowing, all places and all loving. Who could call us to serve him, to bow down in worship before Him, to love Him passionately and to give all to Him?

Group: No one but our God.

Worship Idea 2: A Lyrical Worship

During this worship time you are going to not only sing but pray some of your favourite lyrics.

As the leader:

Choose about 4 of your church's favourite worship songs or hymns. Be sure to have copies of the lyrics for each person in the group.

Have the music recorded on tape or CD to use in the group. If you can't find a CD with your chosen songs on it you might ask a musician in your church to join you for the evening to lead the singing.

Take a few minutes, before you ever sing, to read aloud the lyrics to each song.

Spend some time listening to and singing your chosen songs.

Encourage each of the group members to pick a phrase from one of the songs that means something special to them. Ask for volunteers to share their phrase with the group.

Lastly, close in prayer by having the group members pray the phrase that they chose. This is a very non-threatening way to encourage prayer, but never insist that everyone pray

Worship Idea 3: Worship : God is in charge

Make enough copies of these scriptures for each person in your group.

Highlight phrases so that several (if not all) of the people in your group will get a chance to read a phrase. If there are more phrases than group members, highlight two for each person to read. Take time to have the members read their lines and then repeat them one more time, having the group read the scriptures together out loud. Pray a prayer of praise and thanksgiving.

*Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.
Worship the Lord with gladness; come before Him with joyful songs.
Know that the Lord is God.
It is He, who made us, and we are His;
we are His people, the sheep of His pasture. --Psalm 100:1-3*

*God appoints the sun to shine by day,
God decrees the moon and stars to shine by night,
God stirs up the sea so that its waves roar--
Lord Almighty is his name. --Jeremiah 31:35*

*I will praise You, Lord, for You have rescued me.
O Lord my God, I cried out to You for help, and You restored my health.
Sing to the Lord, all You godly ones! Praise His holy name.
Weeping may go on all night, but joy comes with the morning.
You have turned my mourning into joyful dancing.
I will sing praises to You and not be silent.
O Lord my God, I will give You thanks forever! --Psalm 30:1-12*

Worship Idea 4: It's a line up.

Leader:

1. As best you can set up your room in two lines with chairs facing each other (or imagine 2 lines and talk it through).
2. As people come in have them sit facing a partner.
3. Begin by asking the first question listed below.
4. Have each person share with the person across from them.
5. Then, have one row move one chair to the right and move on to question #2.
6. After each question or instruction, have the whole row move one chair to the right. (one row is always moving, the other row stays in the same place)
7. Continue moving one chair with each question/instruction.
8. Only give the partners about 1-2 minutes for each question.
9. If you have new people, be sure to tell them to introduce themselves each time they sit in a new chair with a new partner.

Worship Questions/Instructions

1. If you had eight hours to do whatever you want, what would you do?
2. Think of your Sunday morning worship service. What do you like best about that service? Why?
3. For what three things are you most thankful for today?
4. What about God thrills you most?
5. Take a moment and thank God for the person sitting across from you.

Worship Idea 5: The Greatness of Quietness

Leader, say something like: To be quiet is to be in a state of gentle stillness. It is in this state that your mind can relax because there are not all kinds of sensory input. Your body can then follow suit and your muscles loosen up. When you fully enter into a state of quietness, it is there that you let go of those things that are weighing you down. You can give up the struggle for control. You can release the notion that you must know everything right now! You can see God's face more clearly and hear His word to you more plainly.

Today we are going to take a few minutes and practice the discipline of quietness. You can stay where you are seated, or you can move to another place here or outside. Get comfortable and stay put once you find your place. Take out your Bible and read the following Psalms and allow God to renew you and refresh you in this time of quietness.

Psalm 4

Psalm 23

Psalm 46

Leader: After about 10 minutes call your group back together. Ask them about this experience. Was it difficult to get quiet? How long was it before you actually could relax? Why is it important to spend time in quietness?

In closing read the following and then pray.

Proof Of Greatness In Quietness

Around the great issues of life there is quietness. Silence characterizes the highest in art and the deepest in nature. The surest spiritual search is made in silence. Moses learned in Midian, and Paul in Arabia, what would have eluded them in the busy haunts of men.

Silence reaches beyond words. The highest point in drama is silence. The most valid emotions do not cry aloud. The most effective reproof is not a tongue lashing. The most poignant grief is not expressed in loud shrieking. The sincerest sympathy is not noisy. The best preparation for an emergency is quietness.

The best proof of greatness is silence. The great engine is almost noiseless, but the cheap model is a "rattletrap." The best proof of confidence is silence. The man who is confident of his position does not strive, nor cry aloud, nor try to explain everything.

"In quietness and in confidence shall be your strength" (Isaiah 30:15).

3. Have each person write his/her name in the blanks.
4. Then have them pass their prayer to the person on their right.
5. Have each person pray the praise/prayer they received; they will be praying for each other.
6. Make sure everyone gets one but you do not have to hand every prayer out.

Worship Idea 7: Praise walking

This worship will take a bit of planning and preparation but it will be worth it.

Praise walking is very simple and profound. It is putting feet to our prayers as we go to different places in our city to pray.

Praise walking is acknowledging God's provision and supernatural working for all of us. It is discerning what is happening, or could happen, in that particular place and praising God for that. Praise walking is low-profile, usually just a couple of friends walking through a neighbourhood, or school or work place, praise praying as they go.

How to praise walk with your group:

Put together groups of 3 or 4 people before your group even arrives (guys together and girls together seemed to work best). Make sure you have at least one person in each group that is very comfortable with praying.

Explain praise walking to your group. Be excited about the adventure on which you are about to embark together.

Assign each of the groups to a different feature near where you are meeting tonight. It could be ...

school

courthouse

church

park

health clubs

shop

Have your group take their Bibles and read I Chronicles 16:9, 25, 35-36, and Psalm 136 out loud on the way to their location.

6. Instruct them to pray short simple praises/thanks for the people that work or live in these places. Encourage them to pray for protection, for wisdom, for Godliness, etc.

7. Give them a specific time to return so that you will have time to talk about what happened. (1 hour out praying is good)

8. Sing a couple of songs of worship, pray, and send out.

9. Follow up with what happened and thank God together for what He is going to do in those places you prayed for that evening

Worship Idea 8: I Go to the Rock

What you need: ☐☐Index card for each person ☐☐The largest rock you can bring in. ☐☐Copies of the reading

READ Joshua 3:14-4:7

Say something like: We, by our remembrances and thanksgiving, are going to build a monument of praise. Like it was for Joshua, it is imperative to recognize and remember the awesome things God has done in our lives.

On your index card I want you to write about one way God has blessed you or answered a prayer or provided help to you.

Come up and tape that praise to this rock... our rock.(Play some music)

Encourage your people to be ready to add to this monument of praise each week. Let it be a reminder of what God is doing in your midst.

READ THE FOLLOWING

Leader: You are the rock of my salvation. I hide in you, I stand on you, I hope in you, I long for you and I trust in you.

Group: You are the rock of my salvation.

Leader: When it feels like life is but a cauldron of chaos and confusion

Group: I go to the rock.

Leader: When I question my purpose and get lost in the mundane mandates of living.

Group: I go to the rock.

Leader: When foolishness is threatening my sanity and peace of mind

Group: I go to the rock.

Leader: When there is no one I can count on, no one to pour out my soul to, no one I can trust

Group: I go to the rock.

Leader: When perfection is expected and I simply can't live up to it,

Group: I go to the rock.

Leader: When the turmoil of the world terrorises my soul,

Group: I go to the rock.

Leader: When injustice seems to be applauded and corruption so easily ignored,

Group: I go to the rock.

Leader: For the rock stands solid. He will not be moved, nor destroyed, nor swayed, nor changed. Even when the earth trembles beneath our feet, Our Rock never gives way. He is strong, he is true, and he is always able.

Group: Thank God! We can go to the rock!

Worship Idea 9: Life's Small Pleasures

Most of us miss out on life's big prizes
(The Pulitzer, the Nobel, Oscar, Tonys, Emmys)
But we're all eligible for life's small pleasures:
A pat on the back. A kiss behind the ear.
A full moon.
An empty parking space. A crackling fire.
A great meal. A glorious sunset. Hot soup.
Don't fret about missing life's grand awards.
Enjoy its tiny delights.
There are plenty for all of us. —15,000 Illustrations

Leader says: It is true that most of us will never win an Emmy or a Pulitzer, but we still are given the privilege of tiny delights. Take a few minutes and think of some of those activities, people, and occurrences that comprise your "tiny delights." (You may want to give everyone paper to write them down.)

After a few moments, ask your group to share what they wrote as a way to begin their praise time. After they have shared these "tiny delights," have them turn to Psalm 103. What you will find here is the "great delight" of our lives. After you have read this Psalm, ask your group to respond in praise by reading the following phrases. Go around the circle reading one phrase per person until all of the phrases have been read.

I will bless the Lord.

I will lift up the Lord as my redeemer and my king.

I will thank the Lord. He has been good to me.

I will never stop talking of His ways, perfect and just.

I was sinking in the quicksand of sin, and God threw me a rope of hope.

I will rejoice over my salvation.

I will sing of His mercies which are new every morning.

I will dance on the mountaintop for my joy is complete in Him.

I will speak of His love for the lost and that I have been found.

I will praise the Lord.

I will honor the Lord.

I will serve the Lord.

I will love the Lord.

I will obey the Lord.

With everything within me, I will bless the Lord. Amen.

Worship Idea 10: Our God Is Close

Our God is not a far away, somewhere in the sky, kind of God. He does not rule from a throne placed out of reach, but rules from a throne within in our hearts. He is close. When we are in trouble, He is close. When we are laughing, He is close. When we are alone, He is close. When we are in a crowd, He is close.

Assign the following scriptures to different readers in your group. Have them read their passages out loud for the group. Make a note to the group that God is close to us. Jeremiah 23:23-24; Isaiah 40:10-11; Psalm 34:1-20

Ask your group, "What is usually happening around you, or to you, when you most feel that God is close? Is it during happy times, sad times, trying times?" Do not allow them to answer now; you are simply getting the thought process started.

Give each person a piece of paper and a pen/pencil.

Ask your group to close their eyes and sit for a few minutes, reflecting on a time or times when they sensed that God was close to them. You may want to play instrumental music quietly while you are reflecting.

Encourage the group members to write down what they remember about that specific time, what was happening, and how they sensed God was near, etc. If they so choose, they could draw a picture instead of writing.

After about 5-10 minutes, ask if anyone would be willing to share what he or she wrote or drew.

Read together the following responsive praise prayer from Psalm 34. The leader reads the bold, and the participant reads the regular font.

**I will bless God every chance I get;
my lungs expand with His praise.**

I live and breathe God who is close by.

God has met me more than halfway, and He has freed me from my anxious fears.

I live and breathe God who is close by.

When I was desperate, I called out and God got me out of a tight spot.

I live and breathe God who is close by.

His angels set up a circle of protection around us while we pray. We will open our eyes and see—how good God is.

I live and breathe God who is close by.

Blessed are we if we run to Him.

I live and breathe God who is close by.

**God keeps an eye on his friends; His ears pick up every moan and groan.
Is anyone crying for help? God is listening, ready to rescue you.**

I live and breathe God who is close by.

If your heart is broken, you will find God right there. If you are kicked in the gut, He will help you catch your breath. God is there every time.

I live and breathe God who is close by.

Thank God, praise God, love this mighty God who is close by.

Amen

Worship Idea 11: Every Moment of every day

This is quite a simple idea. Copy and cut out lots of these little squares with clocks.

On a coffee table in the centre of the group place a clock or alarm clock or something – the louder it ticks the better! The techno savvy might actually prefer to get an mp3 of a clock ticking and play that too.

For worship this evening we are thinking about moments in our lives that cause us, on reflection, to have praise and thanks to God.

Think back over this past week and write down on one square an occasion when you actually did stop and say thank you to God

On a second square write down a time last week (a date and an actual time) when you wish you had stopped to say thank you

Write down a time last week when difficult things happened – as you write the date and time thank him for being with you even in that difficult time

Place you squares round the clock and invite prayers of thanks and appreciation of God.



Worship Idea 12 : The tides of our lives as cause for worship

This idea is based on reflection on Ecclesiastes (3 v1-8)

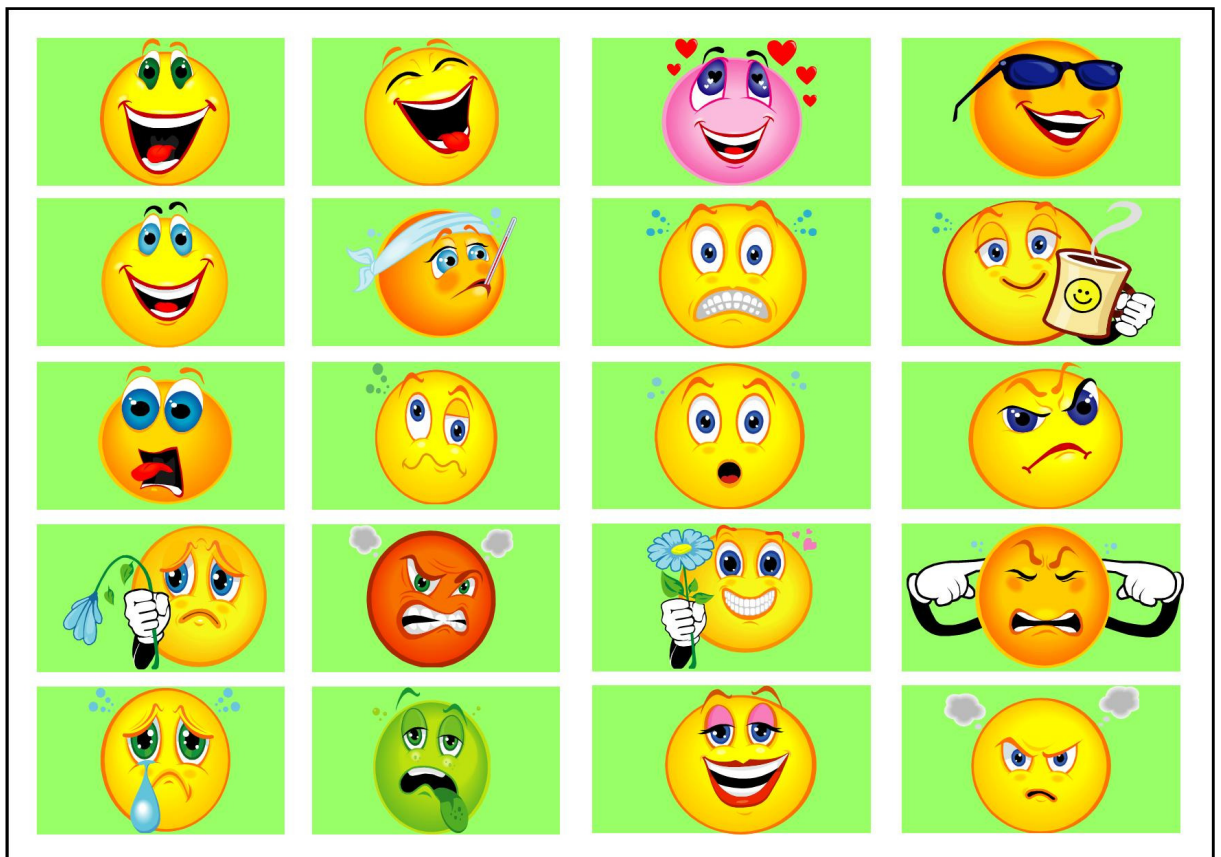
Read the passage together and then give out each person a copy of this sheet below with the faces on.

If these faces were an expression of a relationship with God which one would you choose for the writer of Ecclesiastes?

(Privately now) which face would you choose to reflect your relationship with God right now?

In a few moments of silence let us present ourselves before God (whichever face you chose is fine) and tell him just how we perceive our relationship with Him. Invite him to come into the centre of your life and of the group's life too.

Worship leader prepare a prayer in advance and be ready to read it to conclude this time of worship.



Worship Idea 13: A gift for Jesus

[read carefully though before the worship time – timing is important here]

Give to each person a piece of paper and ask them to write or draw something that represents a gift they would like to give to Jesus. After a time, when not all have finished, ask the members to explain what they have been doing. Then as an act of giving to God place them, unfinished as they are, on a table.

Explain that nothing we offer God is perfect, yet through Christ it is accepted. Give time to look, and to absorb. Then have a time of thanksgiving for God's gifts to us.

Worship Idea 14: Intercession

Spend time in intercession for those who are suffering bereavement or loneliness, for those who are stateless or homeless, those who are experiencing persecution, and others who find it difficult to celebrate. Act in faith for those individuals and situations.

[allow about 15 minutes for this – but be ready after 5 and then 10 minutes to quietly suggest prayer topics if the group gets stuck]

Worship Idea 15: Words that help and heal

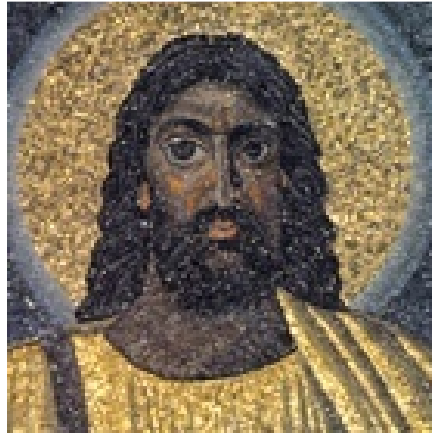
Spend a few moments now as a group asking if there is any particular need that any of you might have. As each person who wants to speak – the others listen to them *and* to God at the same time. After each person has suggested a particular need for prayer spend at least 5 minutes in quietness during which everyone listens for a word of encouragement or a word of scripture to speak or pray over your fellow cell members. Minister to each other words that help and heal.

Start the 5 minutes silence with this prayer or a similar one of your own:

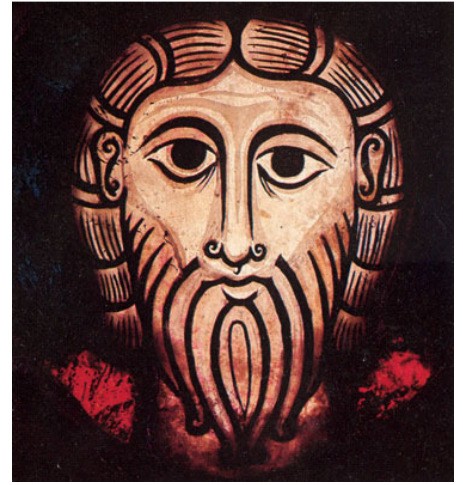
Gracious Spirit, dwell with me;
I myself would gracious be,
And with words that help and heal

Worship Idea 16: Faces of Jesus

Make copies of the pictures overleaf. Distribute the pictures and get a blank piece of A4 paper. Ask the group to call out words that describe Jesus, and write them on the paper. Then ask them to choose one of the words, and to think about it and Jesus for five minutes - one of the pictures might help. End by listening to or singing an appropriate song



This image, from a church in Rome, dates from AD530.



This fragment of stained glass shows one of the first faces of Christ ever to be made in glass. Over 900 years old, experts date it to about the year 1070, and it comes from an abbey church in the borderland between France and Germany on the River Rhine.



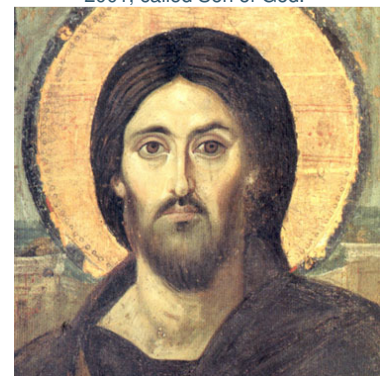
The Shroud of Turin is probably the most famous (and most controversial) image of Christ. Many have argued that it is a direct-contact image of Christ, dating from the 1st century AD



This unfamiliar portrait of Jesus was made specially for a BBC programme broadcast during Easter 2001, called Son of God.



This arresting picture of Jesus as a revolutionary, imitating the style of the famous poster of 1960s fighter Che Guevara, was produced as an advertising poster Easter 1999.



This is the classic Eastern image of Jesus. It does not show us a white-skinned, blue-eyed Jesus, but a man from the Eastern Mediterranean, with olive skin and brown eyes

Worship Idea 17: Jesus prayer chord

[Here is a great idea I picked up from <http://jonnybaker.blogs.com>. This will need some advance preparation but I sense it will be worth it! All the materials are in the resource box.

Jesus prayer cord

This is a prayer idea from the Orthodox Church. You say it slowly repeating it. To help the prayer you have a chord with 100 knots and after each 25 knots a bead. So for each person you need a string and 3 beads. Begin at the tassel. That could be a reminder to you can pray any prayer but given tonight's theme how about: **Jesus, guide me in the choices I have to make each day**, then after 25 knots there was a bead - on reaching that it might be good to gently focus on distractions and put them to one side. After another 25 knots there is another bead. At that point you could focus on someone else to pray for. After another 25 knots another bead at which point you could go into silence. This way you pray the Jesus prayer 100 times and it gives a pattern to it. Obviously you don't need the cord. but having said that it seemed like a good idea so the next day we made some from some string and beads (see pic).... just an idea!

Given the time constraints at cell meeting maybe just tie 5 knots between beads – that is make a string with 20 knots rather than 100. It took me 10 minutes to make the 20 knot practice one. Also you will find that you will have to tie a knot around the bead so that it doesn't just slip down the string. If time is pressing just get folk to finish it at home.

Pray > Jesus, guide me in the choices I have to make each day, x5

At first bead > gently focus on distractions and put them to one side

Pray > Jesus, guide me in the choices I have to make each day, x5

At second bead > think quietly on a choices you have recently made and ones to come

Pray > Jesus, guide me in the choices I have to make each day, x5

At third bead > dwell quietly on the fact that Jesus *has chosen you* for His purposes

Pray > Jesus, guide me in the choices I have to make each day, x5

At tassel > pray for the Holy Spirit to come to you

Worship Idea 18: New Creation

Gather a selection of art materials for people to create a symbol of the new creation, by drawing or painting or writing or making. !!

Find a photo of the throne (search google) and text from Revelation 5v13. When all are ready, place that paper in the centre of the room, and arrange around it everyone's creations. Then have a time when people can praise God for what is to come, in prayer or singing; the focus being God's ruler-ship over the world.

Worship Idea 19: Shaping & moulding us

This will need advanced preparation!

During the week running up to the cell meeting visit a local park or wood and gather a small piece of wood – or branch – or log (if you have a lot of space at cell!) – one for each member of your cell group.

If you have not done this preparation please do not use this worship idea; save it for another week.

In the cell meeting – give out the pieces of wood and invite people to spend a few minutes thinking about what forces or weather, nature , people , traffic etc have had an influence on the shape of the piece of wood you hold in your hand. How has it's texture and colour been shaped? If there are distinguishing mark on the wood how did they get there?
Now share the reading below and ask people to prepare to pray in response..

God does the shaping & the moulding, not us

He's outlined a plan for every one of us. He already has a specific design in mind- what gifts and talents we'll each possess, how we'll use them, & what role we'll play in building His kingdom.

Then, according to the individual unique plans He has for us, He thoughtfully moulds us. He shapes our being & our character, just like

It is all about His workings, not ours. He only asks that we may be willing to be open to Him. Then slowly, but surely, He will work His plans through us. Therefore, may we all willingly go to Him daily to seek His will and plan for our lives. And as we go to him, may we go truly go with a humble and submissive heart that is willing to surrender & offer all that we have to Him so that our lives can truly be a living sacrifice for Him.

Worship Idea 20: Forgiveness and cleansing

In preparation print off Psalm 51 and buy a pack of wet wipes which we will use for this worship time. This evening we prepare ourselves in heart and mind and focus on the prayer of the Psalmist David in Psalm 51 and will pause to pray and reflect as we read through it together.

After reading – take a wet wipe and as you pray quietly wash your hands before disposing of the wipe in a bin.

Worship Idea 21: Celebrating forgiveness (Chalk)

This evening we celebrate the overwhelming forgiveness we have from God.

[gather a piece of black card and pieces of chalk.. distribute the chalk as you introduce this idea – watch out for your host’s carpet and furniture in this worship!!!! Ask your host for a tray to put the card on in a minute]

As we think about our lives lets think about the areas in which we have been forgiven – it’s personal and you won’t be asked to share it out loud... we will pass this Black card round- chalk on it either a word, or a symbol, or a simple drawing that represents the area of forgiveness you have received.

[Pass the card round now and as it goes round ask a few people to look up the following bible verses and be ready to read them out in a minute. They are on the side of the page here so you can cut them out in advance]

When the group have finished writing/drawing on the card and the readers are ready... place the card on a tray or something (mess coming!) – ask the readers to read the verses one after another and as they do so – you take a chalk sideways and literally cover the whole card with a white chalk – so that it ends up completely covered. If you are mildly dramatic time the stokes across the paper with the rhythm of the readers’ text.

We are forgiven people – offer prayers of thanks!

Worship Idea 22: God is all we need

Our worship picks up on this idea that God is all we need. In a moment I will play a short song which is a prayer that maybe we can shape for ourselves.

As we listen to the music – and follow the words – ask the Holy Spirit to speak to you – to specifically show you areas in your life that are less than fully matured – and as you pray ask Him – to be your everything – to provide everything you need and to give you the grace required to turn away from any strongholds of your own doing that might be hindering your joyful daily walk with Jesus.
